- 1) The youth at Infinity have begun to truly grapple with what it means to say that Jesus is the Son of God.
- 2) After not being able to start up Youth Group in the fall, we were able to start up Girls Club in January. The girls involved have taken ownership of the group and really look forward to being there each week.
- 3) Two of our youth got baptized. These youth were baptized as infants but they wanted to get re-baptized to show that following Jesus is something they've now chosen to do for themselves.
